Dear Friends,

Coming from just a little further south of here, I never have expectations about spring on the day the calendar calls the first day of spring, but I do sort of look forward to all the signs of spring that come in April. Like today, for instance. It is the last day of March, but it is raining and it is likely to continue raining until (it turns back to snow) this particular front passes through.

With an early Easter, this is also the time of year that a new Jesus passes through. When I share the post-Easter stories with the children, I refer to the disciples and others as meeting Jesus in a new way. No longer the preacher, teacher, healer on his way to death. He is the preacher, teacher, healer, resurrected and calling us all to new life in him.

Notice how Jesus "passes through" the walls of the locked upper room to let his disciples see him and know that he is alive (Sunday, April 3). And how he "passes through" on the beach, unrecognized at first by his disciples, but later known in a new way as he serves them breakfast (Sunday, April 10). On the fourth Sunday of Easter (April 17), we are reminded that Jesus was, is and always will be the Good Shepherd, whether walking with the disciples or walking with us. The reminder to us to love one another, heard on Maundy Thursday, is repeated on April 24th and it may impact each of us in a brand new way.

The post-Easter stories include after resurrection sightings of Jesus, as well as the older stories shared shortly before his arrest in Jerusalem. Because of the resurrection, all the stories are new and introduce us to the Jesus we may not have known before now. All the stories —whether we hear them on Sunday morning or Wednesday afternoon or we read them for ourselves — all the stories give us a glimpse of the new life to which we are called.

All those dead looking trees and branches, all that snow covered dirt, will soon be sprouting with new life for us to treasure and enjoy. We take delight in the new life that appears in spring. Can you imagine the delight God takes in our acceptance of the new life we are given?

As we continue to celebrate Easter into May, my prayer is that each day of each week, we find new life...in the world...in each other...in ourselves.



March Council Highlights





There is a place and an activity for YOU at Grace:

Would you like to get more active in a ministry at Grace that will benefit you and others, as well? There are a number of opportunities during the week. Everyone is invited to participate in any or all.

- On the first Monday of each month, there is a brief (30 minutes or less) prayer service that includes both silent and spoken prayers. It begins at 6:30p.m. in the worship area.
- On the **second Monday** of each month, the Lutheran Church Women (open to all) meet at 7:00p.m. for bible study and fellowship.
- On **every Tuesday**, the Knit, Pray, Crochet group meets for an hour or two of working on prayer shawls, baby blankets, or an individual project. They gather around 1:00p.m. and stay as long as the yarn, treats, coffee and energy hold out.
- **Primetimers** (that's many of us) gather for lunch at a different area restaurant each month on the **second Tuesday** of the month at 1:00p.m.
- **Wednesda**y is filled with opportunities. Beginning at 10:00am with Cup of Grace, a community coffee time, this is an hour of conversation, coffee, and treats provides a nice midweek social break.
- The Lectionary Bible Study begins at 11:00am., on **most Wednesdays**. Because the study is different each week, people can come as often or as infrequently as desired. Resource materials are always provided, and the coffee remains ready for drinking.
- On the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays, a group of women from Grace and the surrounding community get together to talk and sew quilts. If you can thread a needle or push and pull yarn, one stitch at a time, you are overqualified. Come anytime you can. Quilters start arriving any time after noon, and are often finished around 4, sometimes 5, but you may come and go as you like.
- **Most Wednesdays** at 3:05pm, a bus load of children arrive from the elementary school for our After School Program. While you are welcome to visit just to see all the activity, we also appreciate volunteers in the kitchen, doing crafts, telling stories, reading books, helping with homework, driving to community service events we can always put volunteers to work. Typically, the children are picked up between 5:00 and 5:30p.m.
- On the **fourth Wednesday** of the even months, a group gathers at Grace (around 1:30p.m.) to car pool to Houghton Medical Care and Cypress Manor for worship with the residents. We sing and pray and listen to readings and a brief devotion and the residents are delighted to have us with them in this way. (June, August, October, December, February, and April)
- The **last Thursday** of each month is set aside for Holy Communion Worship at Arbor Green (10:00a.m.) and The Bluffs (11:15 a.m.) It is a great time to spend with those who are not able to get to worship each week. You can accompany our singing, sing along, read the lessons, help serve communion, or just worship with some new friends.
- The office is closed on **Fridays**, but an AA group meets in the fellowship hall. If you are a person in recovery, it may be for you.
- **Sunday morning** brings Choir rehearsal at 9:45a.m.and Sunday School at 10:00a.m., with worship following at 11:00 a.m. Many **Sundays**, we have Coffee Fellowship following the service. A potluck is held on the **last** Sunday of each month. If you like to sing, want to tell stories to children, enjoy needing to meet up with God and God's people, come to any of these.
